

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

ABC Family,

The apostle Paul said, "pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ" (Colossians 4:3). Paul was always looking for open doors in ministry. He longed to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and help believers mature in their discipleship. So he kept his heart and eyes open to the people who were crossing his path. If we want to be a multiplying congregation, we must also adopt this mindset and pray for God to give us ministry opportunities each day.

I'd encourage you to ask two simple questions in your daily prayers. First, "Lord, who around me needs to know Jesus Christ?" We've established through our series that every Christian is a missionary with a mission field. So it is wise to pray for God to give us opportunities to witness. Second, I'd encourage you to pray, "Lord, who around me needs to grow in Jesus Christ?" We've learned God wants to mature each of us and has called us into ministry service. There are likely believers around you that need discipleship. You can be like Paul if you simply look for your Timothy.

Simple, faithful prayers and intentional actions lead to Kingdom multiplication. God wants you to live on mission for Him, so where are those open doors in your life? I hope to see you in church this weekend as we conclude our "Multiply" sermon series. This Sunday is also our Egypt Bible Tour interest meeting. 



From the Pages of Bill's Notebook

During a local summer missions/ministry opportunity with another church, our young adults and their families went to a government-assisted housing area in East Austin in the late 90s. We led a Vacation Bible School for our kids and the kids from that neighborhood in the afternoon. Our church brought an extra large grill, a couple hundred burgers, tables, and chairs and hosted the whole community that evening. It was a great time of laughter and fun for everyone. When it was time to leave, we loaded up the trailer with everything we brought. Our facilities people had to leave early, so I was supposed to see that the church truck and trailer made it back to the church. However, the battery died on the truck from the church that was towing the trailer, and the battery also died on our friends' minivan, which was being used to jump it. As the sun went down we called roadside assistance, but they refused to come to that community after dark because of unfortunate incidents in the past. Our friend's van finally started, but the truck still would not. So, we sent our kids home with our friends in the minivan. No taxis would come to that area and definitely would not tow a trailer. My friend, and pastor of the church we had teamed up with, said, "I'll go home and get my truck, so we can get the trailer back to your church, and you can have the church truck towed in the morning." However, we were quite certain the trailer would not make it through the night in that parking lot. Those housing projects became a very different place after dark, crawling with questionable characters engaged in questionable activities. There were no more kids laughing and playing, no more grandmothers sitting outside in front of their doors smiling, no more happy burger-eating neighbors in the sunshine. As dusk approached, we began seeing more influence from the dark side. We began to see cars with blacked out windows slowly pull up, and shadowy figures walk up. As darkened car windows lowered slightly, money was handed in and small packages were handed out. It wasn't like Anita and I had a place to go hide, so we sat on the curb in our dress shorts, penny loafers, and polo shirts, just like fish out of water. There was no blending in or acting natural in those 50 minutes or so. As we sat, praying and waiting for our pastor friend to return and rescue us and the trailer, a van with blacked out windows slowly pulled up and stopped right in front of us. Anita and I looked at each other and said, "It's been fun, I love you, and at least our kids are with people that we love and trust." We both silently called on the name of Jesus. The front tinted window on the van slowly rolled down and inside we saw four police officers in full riot gear. They asked us, "What are you doing here? You have to get out of here!" We explained that we were stuck without a vehicle and we were waiting for a friend. These officers could not blow their cover, so they could not let us wait in their van. They told us to be careful and drove off. Finally, my friend came with his truck. I never asked him what kind of truck he had, but assumed it was a full-sized truck. He pulled up in a tiny, 15-year-old, stick-shift Datsun truck to tow our giant 2-ton trailer loaded with chairs, tables, and grills. He backed up to the trailer, but we discovered that the hitch ball was too small. So, I said I'll stand on the hitch to hold the trailer tongue down. This was NOT a good idea, but it was the only choice we had. Anita got in the cab with my friend, and I rode that hitch for 10 miles across town like a street surfer. We slowly drove through the city streets with sparks flying from under my feet with every bump. When we finally made it to the church, my hands were frozen to the tailgate because I had clinched it so tightly. That night when we made it home to our kids, we laughed, thanking God for all His grace.

This trailer surfing rescue from our ministry adventure reminds me that we have all been rescued from darkness into God's marvelous Light by Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul was trying to remind the believers in the Ephesian church that they belonged to Jesus, that their lives were rescued, and that they needed to act like the Light of the World,

Jesus Christ. He says, "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8 NIV). Paul says, "You were once darkness," NOT you were once IN darkness. Without Jesus, there is no light in us because of our sin. When we don't belong to the Light, we belong to the darkness and do dark things. But when we belong to Jesus, we act like Him.

Hang in there people! God is glad to be with us! I'm praying for us all!
