

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

ABC Family,

This Sunday, we will distribute our updated financial report in preparation for the 2026 budget year. Church vote for this proposed budget will take place on *Sunday, November 9th*. Inside this year's report you will find highlights of what God has done through the ministry and mission of ABC this year. You will also be able to review the proposed 2026 Budget and understand how your tithes and offerings will be stewarded in this upcoming year.

I am so excited that this 2026 proposed budget is the first debt-free budget in church history! Jesus is going to advance the Great Commission through ABC at a new level, as resources are now reallocated to maximize ministry impact. Accordingly, we are renaming our General Fund, the *Great Commission Fund* this year. This name change gives clarity to the purpose behind our General Fund giving and spending.

Why do we spend money in our budget on facilities? So we can have a beautiful place to gather and make disciples. Why do we budget significant funds for children and youth? So we can make disciples in the next generation. Why do we spend money on personnel? So our staff can equip the saints to go and make disciples. Why do we spend money on outreach events? So we can reach our community to make new disciples. Why do we give away 10% of our contributions to missions? So we can obey Jesus by making disciples of all nations.

I am excited to see how God will advance the Great Commission forward through us as we partner together in our general fund giving. Thank you for your faithfulness, and join me in praying for God's blessing over our church as we enter this debt-free, fiscal year. I also encourage you to join me in praying for our guest speaker, Pastor Bryant Wright. As mentioned on Sunday, I am looking forward to hosting one of my mentors this Sunday at ABC.

Bryant is the founding pastor of Johnson Ferry Baptist Church in Georgia, where he led the church to grow to over 7,000 members during his 38-year pastorate. During that time, he served as the President of the Southern Baptist Convention from 2010-2012. He most recently served as the inaugural President of Send Relief, the compassion ministries arm of the SBC. In his retirement years, Bryant is mentoring young pastors and continuing his broadcast preaching ministry, Right From The Heart Ministries. I know we will all be blessed by his message this Sunday, so please join me at the 8:45am or 11:15am service to give Bryant a warm Austin, Texas welcome.



From the Pages of Bill's Notebook

Parenting Safari! As our family grew, I lost any of the "coolness" that I ever thought I had. As more bundles of joy began blessing our home, the first thing to go was the sporty SUV. We needed something much more practical, so we got a minivan. We started with two old Chrysler vans with wood panel decals, then moved on to a GMC Safari. The van had three rows of "don't make me come back there" seating for eight. It was "so not cool," but we discovered that the minivan was a great place to disciple our kids. It was like a little family church on wheels. They were captive in car seats, they had no control over the audio, and it was the first place Mom and Dad could help them process what happened at school, sports practice, or a friend's house. With four kids, we were always going somewhere: school, soccer, dance, swim, church, and long trips to see the relatives. We began with an opening prayer for a "hedge of protection" around our vehicle. As you can imagine, these preacher's kids also had to listen to Bible Songs, Kids' Praise music, and every episode of Veggie Tales. (And if you turned it up loud enough it would drown out even the most obnoxious whining). When it was a good day, we thanked the Lord for His amazing love and grace. When it was a bad day, conversations were steered toward God's amazing love and forgiveness. When there were challenges to be faced the next day with a tough assignment or a difficult classmate, the discussion turned toward a Biblical life lesson on hanging in there or treating people like we would want to be treated. When an ambulance came by, we prayed for anyone who was hurt. The kids learned some scripture and godly values as they rode around. But don't get the wrong impression, just like most "churches," we also had our share of dysfunctional behavior in that van. Short-tempered parents spewing angry outbursts at kids who were doing the best they could at the moment. Selfish choices to not share the snack or say something nice. Sippy-cups thrown at siblings. Stopping at every other exit on a two-hour trip, because, despite the warnings, at least one of them didn't use the restroom at the last stop. We definitely weren't the most emotionally or spiritually healthy van on the road; however, by God's grace, He used it to help disciple all of us. We were learning to share Cheetos in that van, to respect each other, and wait our turn to talk. We also had a lot of joy in that van, too. We sang together (though we certainly were not the Von Trapp family), and we often got to hear the latest joke or funny incident at school. Perhaps some of the most important discipling came during middle school carpools. Once, my wife had a daily 45-minute commute each way to the gym with seven middle school cheerleaders. My wife would sit, listen, and gently steer the conversation back to something more healthy when the language or topic took a turn for the worse. She was not sure what kind of impact her driver's seat discipling made on these girls from various family backgrounds. But when one of them broke her elbow trying to do a handspring, they all ran straight to my wife asking for prayer and looking to her for support. Maybe that rolling Bible-to-life-lesson classroom in the uncool van did make a difference.

Deuteronomy 6:5-7 (NIV): Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you go along the road.



Raised in Splendor: The Hope of Glorification for a Secular Age by Jason B. Alligood

Jason B. Alligood graduated from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary with a PhD in Systematic Theology. He also attended Calvary Theological Seminary and Moody Bible Institute. He has been on the faculty of Cedarville University as an Assistant Professor of Theology since the fall of 2024. Alligood has also taught as an adjunct professor at various institutions and seminaries for over a decade and has served in various pastoral positions for 27 years. His last position was as the teaching pastor at Fellowship Bible Church in Peoria, Illinois.

Raised in Splendor is a rare book in that it focuses on our future glory in a world where large numbers of books are written about theology. Most Christians know the terms justification, sanctification, and glorification because these three terms are inseparable. In this book, Alligood helps you to understand how justification, sanctification, and glorification are related. Alligood defines glorification as: "the final stage of the triune God's overarching work of salvation in believers in which He fully conforms them to the image of the glorified human nature of the Son and by which they will be totally free from sin and its effects." Alligood discusses hope on two fronts: "...God does what he does for us for the sake of His name and glory," and, "The Biblical idea of hope is centered around God's glory and His promises..." This book is about hope for our future, but he also wants you to see "what benefit glorification is in your life today as you await its fulfillment."
