


Our church directory is a great resource tool that allows members to connect and get to know each other better!

From the Pages of Bill's Notebook

Years ago, in a church in Austin, God gave us the wonderful opportunity to partner with another congregation to host a Backyard Bible Club in the courtyard of an apartment complex. We wanted to reach out to and connect with some families across town to share the Gospel. A friend and mentor of mine was the pastor of a missional church ministering with families in this community. He and I used to meet each month to talk, share some coffee, and pray together. It was at one of those meetings that God led us to team up together and organize a Backyard Bible Club in one of the governmentsubsidized apartment complexes he was trying to reach with his church. Several of the young adults in our ministry eagerly jumped in to help. We went door to door in the apartment complex, distributed free Bibles, and invited all the kids to come outside to learn with us, play some games, and enjoy some hot dogs together. It was a great day. Grandparents sat in lawn chairs in front of their doors and watched as the kids had a day of fun and learning in the Texas heat. At one point, Anita and I were teaching some first graders, and things seemed to be going well. We had played a game and ate some Goldfish and began to tell the children a Bible story. In the middle of the story, one of the kids grabbed a glass bottle, smashed it against the curb, and began threatening the other kids and us with it with a wild look in his eyes. Everyone froze — except Anita. The mother bear protector came out in her and she stood up, walked straight toward this broken glass-wielding first grader, pointed at the bottle and said, "In the name of Jesus, you put down that bottle!" The next sound we heard was glass plinking on the asphalt. The kid had dropped the bottle, the wild look in his eyes had been replaced by shame at the realization of what he had just done, and he began to cry. Anita hugged him, told him everything was okay, prayed with him, and sat next to him as we continued with the Bible teaching. We have no idea what that child had experienced in his life that would trigger a fear response so intense. We could not understand why a child would grab a glass bottle, smash the end of it, and use it as a weapon against the other neighbor kids and two adults wearing madras shorts, smiling, and holding Bibles. Something had triggered his fear, but the good news is, something also triggered his release from that fear - the name of Jesus! When we finally arrived home with our own kids later that evening, we hugged them. Once again we called on Jesus, praising His name, because everyone had made it home alive and in one piece. We rejoiced that we all got to experience the power of Jesus' name, feel the grace of His goodness, and witness His great love!

The Apostle Paul told the church he loved that because of Jesus' humility to come to the earth and save us, His name would be powerful and above every name. He says, "For this reason God highly exalted Him and gave Him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow — in heaven and on earth and under the earth — and every tongue will confess that Jesus

Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" Philippians 2:9-11 CSB. What's in a name? When we are fearful, we can call on the name of Jesus! When we are blessed, we can praise the name of Jesus! His name is powerful and wonderful; above all names!

Hang in there people! God is glad to be with us! I'm praying for us all!



A Short Guide to Evangelism and Missions by D. Scott Hildreth

This month at ABC, we are emphasizing missions. The highlighted book this week is *A Short Guide to Evangelism and Missions* by D. Scott Hildreth. Scott has been in Christian ministry for over thirty years. He and his family served with the International Mission Board (IMB) in Western Europe and Central Asia. He has also served as a pastor, interim pastor, and has written several books on missions, spiritual formation, and theology. Scott is currently an Associate Professor of Missiology, Director of the Lewis A. Drummond Center for Great Commission Studies, and Assistant Professor of Global Studies at Southeastern Baptist Theology Seminary in Wake Forest, North Carolina.

In the book's introduction, Hildreth says, "The goal of this book is to provide motivation as well as practical tools for you to embrace God's mission as your frame for life." This is a concise and short book of only five chapters which takes you through the final words of Jesus to His disciples found in Matthew 28:18-20, which are the center of Christian evangelism and missions. The introduction gives a brief history of how the meaning of missions has evolved through the years. Each chapter breaks down the meaning of Jesus' words in Matthew and provides answers to the following questions: Am I Really Responsible for the Whole World?; By What Authority Do We Go?; Who in the World Are We Trying to Reach?; What about Other Gods?; and What is the Missionary Task? Each chapter ends with a Discuss and Reflect section. It is Scott's "... desire to encourage and equip more Christians to follow God's call to the mission field." Those who read this book will learn that obedience to Jesus' command is not an option. It is our responsibility and privilege; we are all called to be missionaries. Hildreth says, "My hope is that you will begin to think about your entire life as a response to God's will."
