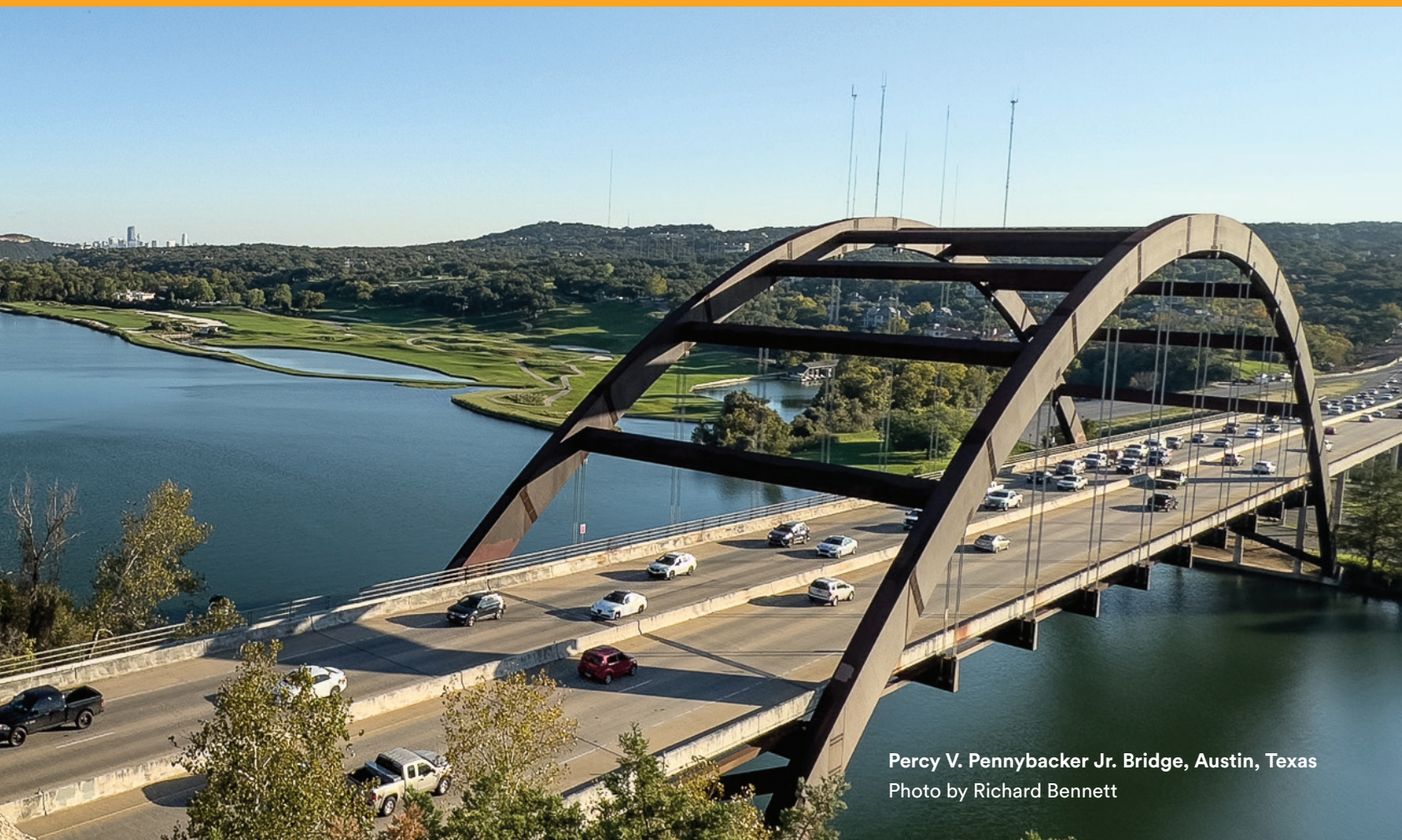

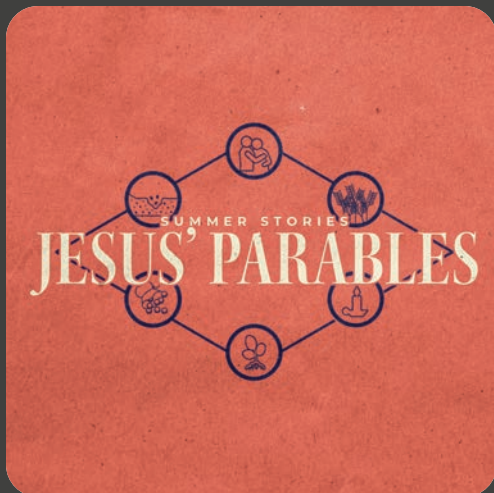

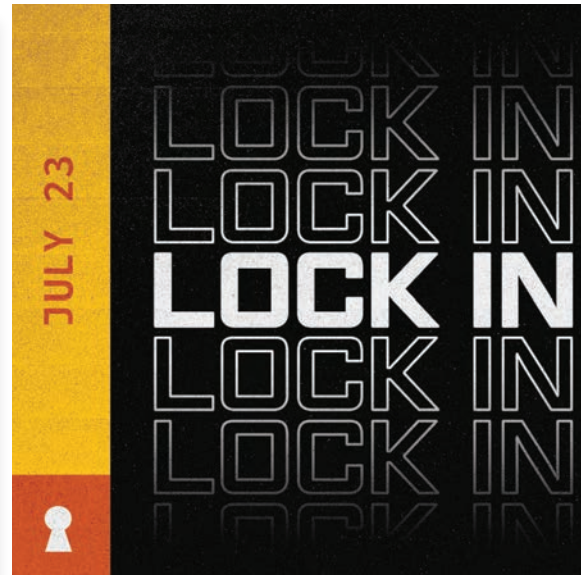

*Volunteer group deployed at Trinity Baptist Church in Kerrville, Texas*



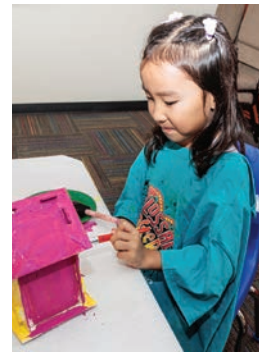
Texans on Mission Damage Assessment, Chaplin, Feeding, Shower/Laundry, and Home Mud Out teams started arriving at Trinity Baptist Church in Kerrville on Monday, July 7th. Through last Saturday, the Austin Baptist Association Shower/Laundry trailer, which our church supports both financially and by several members assistance during deployments, provided 236 showers and 100 loads of laundry for the above Texans on Mission teams. The Shower/Laundry unit will stay in Kerrville until all the identified home mud out, and possibly tree removal, jobs are completed over the next few weeks.

This week, other Texans on Mission teams are starting mud out work in San Angelo where approximately 700 homes were flooded on July 4th.

# From the Pages of Bill's Notebook

As I count my blessings, one is my father-in-law. This tall, well-dressed, well-spoken, gentle giant of a man is a great leader. He has led in the corporate world with Dean Witter, Discover, and Sears in cities across the United States. Known to his friends as “Hooty,” he is a man of integrity who is sought out for deacon boards, finance committees, and other leadership opportunities in the church. This great Bible study teacher always looked for a church home on the first Sunday he arrived in every new city his career placed him in (of which there were at least ten cities). He raised two wonderful children, their spouses, six grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, and all their significant others. His generosity seems to have no end. He has helped provide vehicles for my teenagers, helped with kids’ clothes, vacations, and in countless other ways. He even invited all six of us and a rescue dog to live in his home when we were “homeless” between churches. He let us stay in his fancy neighborhood, even when our dog kept climbing over his prized Corvette, breaking through the garage window screen to escape, and roaming free to chase rabbits and golf balls on the golf course. This dog also bit his dog’s ear, which of course bled profusely. All that to say, Hooty’s patience is enviable. Granddad has a special relationship with each of his grandchildren, impacting their lives at significant times in their formative years and still now as young adults. He and Nana showed up for every milestone and special event in their lives, with praise, gifts, and endless words of encouragement. He is quite the chef too. He makes fantastic burgers, brats, flank steak, brisket, ribs, and pork. His Thanksgiving and Christmas feasts are unrivaled. His love and care for people comes out in the wonderful food he prepares and serves for his family and friends. He is a great husband to his wonderful wife. He is an excellent duck hunter, skilled skeet shooter, and avid golfer — and his duck salad is the best I’ve ever tasted!

He is also a gifted wood carver and has carved wonderful geese, ducks and other waterfowl with grace and precision. He has given these as priceless wedding gifts to each family member. After Anita’s and my broken engagement and reuniting, when hearts were tender, raw and broken, his thoughtfulness was reflected in his careful wood carving that brought hope and healing to our lives. He spoke of how when carving the Canada goose for us, it was made in three separate parts that were fused together. Two separate parts made the body, but without the connection to the third part, the head, the two parts meant nothing. He spoke about the two body parts representing Anita and me that would become “one” and that Christ must be the head of the marriage, and without Him the relationship would be meaningless. Love and respect for Christ and each other would prevail as the foundation for a happy home.

This is great wisdom for all of us. When marriages, churches, and communities are broken, we need Christ, the head of us all to join us together, lead us and heal us. The Apostle Paul tells us, “...Christ is the head of the church. He is the Savior of the body.” Ephesians 5:23 (CSB) I’m so thankful for Jesus and this man I count as a blessing. My father-in-law is like a second father to me, and he is the spiritual patriarch for his clan. His wisdom from above points us all toward Jesus and healthy connection. I’m impressed with the ways he leads his family, his church, his career, under the headship of Christ.

## The Church History Handbook by Holman Reference Books

The highlighted book for this week is ***The Church History Handbook*** by Holman Bible Publishers. The publishers of this book focused, “on presenting important people, events, and ideas in a visually compelling way.” The time periods covered include: the Early Church (AD 100-200), the Patristic Church (AD 200-500), the Middle Ages (AD 500-1500), the Reformation (AD 1500-1700), and the Modern Period (AD 1700-Present). Each section contains a Historical Overview, Timeline, Historical Christian Doctrines, and short biographies of important church leaders during that time period. The book includes charts, tables, maps, infographics, quotes from early church fathers, 25 doctrinal studies of important ideas related to our Christian faith, and much more. The Biblical text in this book comes from the Christian Standard Bible. The publisher says, “***The Church History Handbook*** is intended to enhance your reading and understanding of history of the Christian Church and ultimately point you to ‘God’s glory in the face of Jesus Christ’ (2 Cor. 4:6).”
