

From the Pages of Bill's Notebook

Dear Church Family,

My name is Kevyn Kellogg. It's such a privilege to share with you today. When our Pastor of Care Bill McGinnis invited me to write this guest message, I felt both honored and deeply humbled. I'm not a theologian, a speaker, or someone who grew up in church. I'm just a mom of four—still learning, still memorizing my Bible verses, and soaking up every bit of truth and grace I can.

My faith journey began with the quiet encouragement of my great-grandmother who always told me to keep God first and to pray. As a little girl, I did just that. I would talk to God, write to Him, and somehow He would always respond. Long before I knew theology, I knew Him as relational and near.

That foundation eventually led us, my husband Josh and I, to Austin Baptist Church about two and a half years ago. Since then, we've been overwhelmed by the love, presence, and authenticity of this community. This church has truly shown us what it means to walk with God, and to walk with one another.

Now I feel the Lord asking me to share something deeply personal. A story that still shakes us to our core but also fills us with awe. A story of pain, of rescue, and of resurrection. A story that led to a sacred moment together with our church family on Sunday.

This past Sunday, July 20th, we had the indescribable joy of watching our daughters, Wynter and Eiley, be baptized.

That moment, seeing them walk into the water in full faith, full awareness, full life, took my breath away. And the date? It marked exactly four years since the day Wynter nearly drowned. A day that changed everything for our family. A day when we witnessed God's hand move in a way we could never deny.

Four years ago to the exact day on July 20th, our daughter Wynter drowned. She was just three. That afternoon, my husband Josh took our girls, Parker, Eiley, and Wynter to the pool, while I stayed back to help our youngest Sawyer feel better. It was just the four of them. Earlier that day, I had taken them to swim lessons. Because of that, they were full of confidence. Wynter was playing on the steps of the pool while Josh watched the other girls dive. He looked away for just a moment, and in that brief moment... she slipped under. No splash. No sound. Just gone. Right beneath him. Josh pulled her up, lifeless and blue. With no phone and no one around, he screamed for help. Panicked and unsure of what to do, he began an untrained CPR attempt. He pressed on her chest. Blew into her mouth. Cried out for help. Slowly, she began to cough. To vomit. To breathe. And God sent help. A neighbor we hardly knew, whose house backed up to the pool, just happened to be on her deck. She heard him and called 911.

Wynter was barely breathing when I got the call. I ran to the pool—literally ran, even though my legs felt like lead, pushing baby Sawyer in the stroller, shoes falling off. I saw the ambulance and climbed inside. She was breathing, but her eyes were glazed. She was incoherent, and still blue. I was hysterical. They told me to stay calm, to help keep her calm. But inside, I was crumbling.

Another neighbor, who we also barely knew at the time, saw the ambulance and stopped to help our other children, taking them safely to her home until Josh's parents could arrive. More help—sent by God.

At the hospital, Wynter still couldn't answer questions. Her lungs were filled with water. They feared she might have brain damage. We texted anyone we could think of. We begged for prayer, prayer chains, help trying to reach THE Miracle Worker. I couldn't even form words myself, just, "Please, God. Save her."

Then something miraculous happened. After her first round of tests, she fell asleep. Suddenly, the room was filled with the smell of chlorine. Her body started sweating—soaking her bed. The water was pouring out of her. I know it sounds strange, but I know what I witnessed: God was pulling the water out of her. When she woke up, she was back. Smiling. Alert. Whole.

"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit." – Psalm 34:18

It took time for us to realize: we had lived through a miracle. We later learned that twins admitted that same night died from their injuries. Another child was left permanently impaired. But Wynter—our sweet miracle—walked out of that hospital the next day. But the weight of it, the closeness of death, the trauma, the fear, lingered. Josh was haunted by the image of pulling her out, lifeless. Eiley and Parker watched it all unfold. I lived in that fragile space of both gratitude and exhaustion.

Life didn't pause. But we did. And slowly, God began to heal not just Wynter—but us too.

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you." — Isaiah 43:2

We've held this story close for years and haven't talked about it much publicly. Now, we get to tell the rest of the story. It's sacred and deeply emotional, but this baptism—this resurrection moment—felt like the right time to share what God has done.

Four years later, to the day, Wynter walked into the water again, full of life and with full awareness and full faith to declare that she belongs to Jesus. And Eiley, her big sister—who watched her dad pull Wynter's lifeless body from the pool and prayed from the sidelines that God would save her—was baptized too.

We don't take a single breath for granted. We remember the weight of what we almost lost. And we praise the God who gave her back to us.

"We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead... we too may live a new life." – Romans 6:4


Thank you for standing with us—in faith, in unity, in awe of a Savior who still performs miracles. Being surrounded by this church family as our daughters were baptized was something we'll never forget. We felt your prayers, your presence, and your love. Thank you for being the kind of community that walks together through both trauma and triumph. It felt so special to witness this moment among people who care so deeply. God is so good.

Sons of Encouragement: Five Stories of Faithful Men Who Changed Eternity by Francine Rivers

Francine Rivers is an American author who began her career writing historical romance novels. In 1986, she became a Christian and spent a lot of time reading the Bible before she began to write Christian novels. Her first Christian book was *Redeeming Love*, which she views as a statement of her faith. Two of her Christian novels, *The Last Sin Eater* and *Redeeming Love*, have been made into movies. On her website Rivers says, "I hope that reading my stories will make you hunger to read the Word, Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life. I pray that you will finish my books and pick up the Bible with a new excitement and anticipation of a real encounter with the Lord Himself."

The Sons of Encouragement is made up of five individual novellas about five men of the Bible. These five men who served in the shadow of others are: The Priest - Aaron, The Warrior - Caleb, The Prince - Jonathan, The Prophet - Amos, and The Scribe – Silas. The story of each one of these men is based on Biblical accounts. Rivers states that with the Bible as a foundation, "I have created action, dialogue, internal motivations and in some cases, additional characters that I feel are consistent with the Biblical record. I have attempted to remain true to the scriptural message in all points, ..." After each man's story there is a Bible study called Seek and Find, which includes passages from the Bible to read, discussion questions, and additional verses for you to think about. Rivers hopes that as you read the supporting scriptures and study them that, "... you will become aware of the continuity, the consistency, and the confirmation of God's plans for the ages – a plan that includes you." This book is rated 4.4 on Goodreads.
