






















Camp Mabry Donation Packing

From the Pages of Bill's Notebook



In 1976, when I was 12 years old, there was a huge Bicentennial celebration in our country. The celebration of our 200 years of independence was nationwide. The day had been anticipated and planned for years. There were 13 starred and striped Grand Union flags with the Betsy Ross design on decals, fabric, and t-shirts, each with a 76 on it. The great seal of the United States was everywhere. The seal featured a bald eagle carrying 13 arrows for the 13 colonies coming together in

unified strength, but it also carried an olive branch. This showed that the U.S. would seek peace and diplomacy, but was always unified and ready to defend itself from enemies, foreign or domestic. The U.S. seal features the Latin words "E Pluribus Unum" which in English means, "Out of many, one." The national motto of the United States, "In God we trust," was proudly displayed. There was a lot of pride about how God had blessed our country at that time. Everything was red, white, and blue. The number 76 and the Liberty Bell were proudly displayed everywhere. On July 4th, many famous musicians performed, including Elvis, Aerosmith, Eagles, Loggins and Messina, and many more. President Gerald Ford addressed the Nation. There were War of Independence re-enactments, a huge fireworks show in New York Harbor near the Statue of Liberty, and almost every city hosted a celebration. The huge nationwide party was a spectacle to watch on network television. Next year, 2026, will be The United States' 250th anniversary of independence. I am eager to see the kinds of celebrations we will have.

King David reminds God's people to keep trusting in God. He says, "The LORD foils the plans of the nations; He thwarts the purposes of the peoples. But the plans of the LORD stand firm forever, the purposes of His heart through all generations. Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people He chose for his inheritance" (Psalm 33:10-12). Many things have changed in the last 50 years and I pray we remain "one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." I hope that we can still be "E Pluribus Unum" and even with our differences we can continue to help make the world a better place.

Hang in there people! God is glad to be with us! I'm praying for us all!




