





Many of you will remember that in 2022, ABC participated in a missions effort called **Project Homebuild**, where we literally built a home in the Great Hall for a family of



From the Pages of Bill's Notebook



What a great Saturday it was 15 years ago! My 15-year-old son had wanted to go to a University of Georgia game for a long time. One day my wife said, "Let's drive down and see if we can get tickets." We left Chattanooga, where we lived at the time, a little after 8:00 in the morning. We arrived on campus just before kickoff. Anita, my "Blonde Bombshell with Bible Power", jumped out of the car and secured a couple of tickets for us as I maneuvered through the game day traffic. A block later she chased us down, motioned me out of the driver's seat, and said, "Get going, you are about to miss kickoff!" She then switched with me in the driver's

seat and drove off. Price and I made our way to Sanford Stadium and went way up to where the air is clear (and hot). We both stood at the rail with goosebumps as the shouts crescendoed into, "Gooo Dawgs, Sick'em, Woof, Woof, Woof," when Georgia kicked off (pictured above).

It was a great day of SEC football...for my son. I, on the other hand, was kinda quiet as my grad school alma mater was being embarrassed. It was like a Georgia highlight reel the whole game, and a blooper reel for the University of Tennessee. UGA thoroughly thumped UT, 41-14. The Vols' performance was riddled with penalties, miscues, and mistakes. As one UT fan near us said, "Tennessee was playing 'flag' football," because they couldn't get through a single set of downs without a penalty flag. But I wasn't too upset by the loss. These teams have played each other for well over 100 years. There was always a next year for the rivalry, but enjoying the game with my teenage son had a much shorter shelf life.

I wouldn't have traded this day for anything. I will never forget the excitement on my son's face and the goosebumps we had as we watched the teams rush onto the field with the bands playing in loud competition. There was the sea of red shirts and pom-poms (with a few orange sections). There were Georgia flags, cheerleaders, mascots, painted fans, T-shirts, even pants with Georgia on them. This was a memory I hope he remembers fondly. I was so thankful for the opportunity to spend this time with him as the clock ticked down on his childhood years. He is 30 now, with two sons of his own to watch football with. I am proud to say that he finally saw the light and became a Tennessee fan when he earned a graduate degree from that Big Orange school on the banks of the beautiful Tennessee River.

Psalms 127:3 says, "Children are a blessing and a gift from the Lord." Enjoy the gifts while you've got them, because they will soon do what God designed them to do... grow up! They are still gifts, just maybe not in the same way they were.

Hang in there people! God is glad to be with us! I'm praying for us all!



Bonhoffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy by Eric Metaxas

This week's author, Eric Metaxas, has written fourteen books that include biographies, a memoir, several nonfiction books, and over thirty children's books. He is the host of a live broadcast series called *Socrates in the City:* Conversations on the Examined Life, where he interviews a wide variety of guests. Metaxas also hosts a nationally syndicated radio show, The Eric Metaxas Radio Show. Metaxas is known as a cultural commentator and has had his views published in many well-known newspapers and magazines. He lives in New York City with his family.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran pastor (Pastor), a neo-orthodox theologian (Prophet), and an anti-Nazi dissident who worked from the inside of the Third Reich to dismantle it (Spy). His book, published in 1937, *The Cost of Discipleship*, is considered a classic. Bonhoeffer was executed for his role in the plot to kill Hitler (Martyr), but his own parents, who were living in America, did not learn of his death until they heard about his funeral. Metaxas, who read other Bonhoeffer biographies and did extensive research, wanted to tell the story of Bonhoeffer's life that had not been told. He says in the introduction that in writing this book, "I hoped to tell Bonhoeffer's extraordinary story in a way that could introduce him to those who did not know him." Metaxas hopes to lead people to read Bonhoeffer's own works so, "...they might catch a measure of his love for God who was the undimmed source of his peace and courage." This book includes Notes, a Bibliography, an Index, and A Reading Group Guide.
