


Take a step of faith this week and build fellowship in our church. Don't just go to church. Become a part of the family because we have room for you.






INDUCTIVE: HEBREWS - MONDAYS & TUESDAYS

A study of prolegomena as the nature, method, and sources of theology; revelation, especially the inspiration, authority, sufficiency, inerrancy, and canonicity of the Bible; and theological hermeneutics, including an introduction to dispensationalism. *Required prerequisite to all Systematic Theology (ST) courses.*

EML5331 PERSONAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT | SEPT. 25-27 (TH. 6-9, FRI. 8-5, SAT. 8-3) DR. KEVIN GANDY

This course will help leaders understand the complexities of personal leadership development, including how one's personality, temperament, and strengths impact a leader within personal, ministry, parachurch, and other contexts. *Online enrollment limited to 16 students*.

From the Pages of Bill's Notebook



After my father's early retirement from medicine and his 35 different missionary travels around the world, my mother found a piece of land on the French Broad River near Knoxville that she knew he would love. My father, realizing her brilliance, bought the 18 acres of farm and woodland. We instantly knew God had blessed it, and it became affectionately known as "Tuckahoe," named for the creek that laves its north boundary line. My father hunted, fished, farmed, built a log home and a barn, all while he became the primary caregiver for my mother who declined there with Alzheimer's for 17 years until her passing. The family loved

and enjoyed my father's refreshing place of solace. The rich bottom land had apparently been enjoyed by the indigenous people many years before, because we found many flint arrowheads when we tilled the garden. The property brought great joy to all those who visted. The peace that settled over you as you drove the gravel road, stepped onto the wraparound porch, and heard the flowing river would lower your blood pressure by ten points. We canoed, tubed, waded, and fished in that cool, rolling river. We hunted deer, turkey, and other game birds. We drove the old John Deere and helped plant and harvest the yearly garden. Writing this, I am filled with nostalgia for the life events we celebrated with family and friends there: birthdays, holidays, graduations, funerals, reunions, and more. We also celebrated God's creation itself from season to season, year to year, high water and low water, living and dying. We watched as bucks jousted in rut and as speckled fawns emerged in the spring. We watched the spectacle of a firefly show, as millions covered the field in spring. It was better than any firework show I had ever seen and much more calming. A few years ago, tortured by the prospect of having to sell the place when my parents had both passed away, we tried to make the property a vacation rental. Though it was a popular spot that received high ratings, this became untenable because it exhausted my sister. I was in ministry a thousand miles away and couldn't help care for the place or the guests. After much prayer and wringing of hands, we sold the beloved property. We decided it was time for someone else's family to celebrate life and God's creation there, while we continued to cling tightly to the memories and tell the stories.

As King David was speaking to Israel, he said, "We are here for only a moment, visitors and strangers in the land as our ancestors were before us. Our days on earth are like a passing shadow, gone so soon without a trace" (1 Chronicles 29:15 NLT-SE). And the writer of Hebrews, speaking of heaven, picking up where the words of the Hebrew King left off, says, "For this world is not our permanent home; we

are looking forward to a home yet to come" (Hebrews 13:14 NLT-SE). My family is forever thankful for the blessings and memories from Tuckahoe, "Yet God has made everything beautiful for its own time. He has planted eternity in the human heart" (Ecc. 3:11a).

Hang in there people! God is glad to be with us! I'm praying for us all.



Pour Out Your Heart: Discovering Joy, Strength, and Intimacy with God Through Prayer by Jeremy Linneman

Jeremy Linneman is the Lead Pastor of Trinity Community Church in Columbia, Missouri. He also served for seven years as a staff pastor of Sojourn Church in Louisville, Kentucky. This is Jeremy's second book. Trinity Community Church is known for emphasizing prayer and spiritual renewal. As a pastor he says that often he has a conversation with a Christian new to Trinity who tells him that they have never learned how to pray.

In *Pour Out Your Heart*, Linneman "approaches prayer as both communion with God and an act of boldness seeking God's transformative power to work mightily in our world." In Chapter 1, Receiving the Father's Embrace, Linneman discusses our spiritual insecurities and points us to loving "the Father on an Abba level." Chapter 2, What Do You Want?, focuses on God meeting our needs and wants. In Chapters 3-9, Nine Ways/Practices to Pour Out Your Heart are presented and discussed. These Practices include: #1 Reorienting to God - Adoration, #2 Descending with the Mind into the Heart - Contemplation, #3 Collapsing into Jesus - Confession, #4 On Earth as in Heaven - Intercession, #5 The Most Basic and Important of Prayers - Petition, #6 Praying through Heartache - Lament, #7 Cultivating a Hunger for God – Fasting, #8 Giving Up Control of Your Life – Surrender, and #9 The Path to Joy and Celebration – Thanksgiving. Linneman says, "Pour out your heart, and God will pour something back into your heart. He will fill it with joy, peace, and strength. He will pour His very own love and power into your life."

Arise, cry out in the night, as the watches of the night begin: pour out your heart like water in the presence of the Lord. -Lamentations 2:19
